### UPDATE ON THE BUILDING WORKS

With work now well under way this is an opportunity to keep the congregation informed of our progress. As you know, our halls required updating to ensure that we are compliant with current legislation such as the Disability Discrimination Act 1995 and particularly the Disability Discrimination (Northern Ireland) Order 2006. The updating of our halls will also be of great benefit to our congregational life.

After extensive planning and with the approval of the congregation to move forward with this project, work commenced in July and has moved forward significantly since then. We will now be showing regular photo updates on our progress, on the screens in our Church before our Sunday Worship.

In a project of this scale you can be sure that we will encounter unforeseen factors that only come to light when walls have been stripped back etc. After discovering that a raft foundation had been built to the existing Halls, we had to redesign the toilet and store layouts. Floor levels also had to be altered to accommodate this. We feel that the redesign has not altered the functionality or quality of the redevelopment.

We have also decided to use suspended ceiling tiles to all ceilings. This will improve appearance and also gives access to all M & E engineers for any on-going maintenance work, for no cost difference. We are going to alter the entrance screen/wall to our halls as this was originally designed as a temporary structure and are currently looking at our options for this area.

As the toilets will now be out of use we have a portable toilet facility located in the car park area and of sufficient size to comfortably accommodate wheelchair access. This is located beside the S u n d a y S c h o o l portacabin.

# **OUR FINANCIAL POSITION**

Our budget figure for the work on the halls is  $\pm 250,000$  inc. VAT with Development Fund paying  $\pm 170,000$ .

The Executive Committee of the Trustees of the Crescent Fund have agreed to provide a loan of £30,000 over 5 years at a rate of 1.25% interest.

We are applying to the Northern Bank for a £50,000 loan at the charity rate of 4.75% to be repaid over 10 years.

So that is everything paid, or is it? Well we do have to pay off our debts. Everyone is asked to help according to their means, through:

- Direct Giving
- Regular contributions to the Development Fund
- Harvest Appeal
- Interest free loans (bank rate is such at the moment that money on deposit is virtually interest-free anyway –see the Treasurer about payback times)

To reduce the costs the Development Committee agreed that only essential work should go ahead at this time with e.g. a new roof for the Coulter Hall or a link between Church and Halls with all the additional space that would create put on hold until we can accumulate enough new funds.

Already, we have received an interest free loan from an anonymous giver of £1,000. Interest free loans will be repaid in 2018 when the Crescent loan is paid off or at any time before then if a family requires the return of their capital.

Don't forget, the  $\pm 170,000$  from the Development Fund is assuming we receive  $\pm 10,000$  in our Harvest offering this year. We received  $\pm 9,500$  last year so please give generously this Harvest to help us meet our new target!

Wouldn't it be wonderful to move into a new era after 250 years of congregational life with a facility to be proud of and debts to no-one.

I require assistance with historical information regarding the following organisations :


